- Completion of a minimum 15 semester hours for requirements of one or two other endorsements in Social Studies Education as detailed below.
- Completion of the TEP Professional Education Course Requirements and field experiences.
- MAT graduate degree requirements include the professional education course requirements, a
  final examination, and a minimum of 47 semester hours of graduate credit, to include a
  minimum of 8 semester hours in courses numbered 6000 or above in social studies education
  and a minimum of 9 semester hours of graduate coursework in history or a social science
  area.

# Social Sciences Content Course Requirements

Complete social sciences content course requirements: a major in anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, or sociology, or the equivalent, 30 s.h. minimum, plus an additional 15-27 s.h. in other social science content courses, for endorsement in the major subject and one or more additional endorsements.

The recommended course distribution requires courses in the major and courses in the following areas: American government (minimum 9 s.h.), American history (minimum 9 s.h.), and world history (minimum 9 s.h.). This recommended course distribution satisfies requirements of endorsement in the major subject and endorsement **1861 Social Sciences - Basic 5-12** (permits teaching American history, world history, and American government), with options for additional endorsements.

Other course distributions are possible with faculty approval.

Endorsement **186 All Social Sciences 5-12** is available as an optional added endorsement. An lowa teaching license that includes endorsement **186 All Social Sciences** authorizes teaching of all history and social science subjects in lowa in grades 5-12. Requirements of endorsement **186** include requirements for **1861 Social Sciences - Basic 5-12** (9 s.h. American history, 9 s.h. world history; and 9 s.h. American government), plus at least 6 s.h. of coursework in all of the four subject areas: economics, geography, psychology, and sociology.

### 159 Anthropology 5-12

Endorsement **159 Anthropology 5-12** can be earned with a minimum of 15 s.h. in anthropology when completed with one or more other additional grades 5-12 social studies endorsements.
