**Requirements**

- Admission to the added endorsement program. Contact the Office of Student Services, [ask-education@uiowa.edu](mailto:ask-education@uiowa.edu), for application information.
- Teachers who have not student taught at the secondary level must complete a supervised practicum experience in a high school setting.
- Completion of methods of teaching secondary social studies courses; plus social science content courses to include 9 semester hours in each of American history, world history, and American government, as specified below. This completes 1861 Social Sciences – Basic 5-12 and permits teaching American history, world history, and American government.
- Holders of endorsement 1861 may be eligible for added endorsement numbers 160 Economics 5-12, 161 Geography 5-12, 163 Psychology 5-12, or 165 Sociology, with additional courses.
- Completion of social science content courses to include 9 semester hours in each of American history, world history, and American government, and 6 semester hours in each economics, geography, psychology and sociology completes the requirements for endorsement 186 All Social Sciences 5-12 and authorizes teaching of all history and social science subjects in Iowa in grades 5-12.
