Field Experience Requirements

ELL field experiences are incorporated as requirements of program courses:

- EDTL:4467 Methods and Practicum: ESL and Bilingual Education requires 15 clock hours of elementary school field experience.
- EDTL:4498 Applied Linguistics and the Multilingual Classroom (undergraduate students) and EDTL:6483 Second Language Classroom Learning (graduate students) require 15 clock hours of secondary school field experience.
- EDTL:4087:0031Seminar Curriculum and Student Teaching: World Language and ESL is completed in the last semester in the ELL program and requires access to a classroom that includes English learners or bilingual learners. Options for this classroom include:
 - o Student teaching placement in ELL: Half-semester in an ELL or bilingual classroom, or
 - Student teaching placement(s) in another subject that include English learners or bilingual learners.

Student Teaching Course Registration

Most teacher candidates for initial licensure complete one-half of their student teaching semester in an ELL placement. Grade levels of ELL student teaching placements vary, depending on the student's TEP area and individual advising from ELL program faculty. Typical placements are:

- Students in Elementary Education TEP: ELL student teaching in an elementary setting.
- Student in World Language Education TEP: One-half student teaching semester in ELL and one-half in World Language Education.
- Student in grades 5-12 TEP (English Education, Mathematics Education, Science Education, Social Studies Education): ELL student teaching in secondary-level setting (grades 7-12).
- Student in grades K-12 TEP (including Art Education, Music Education): No ELL student teaching is required.
