 - 3 semesters of less-commonly taught languages such as Arabic, Chinese, or Japanese, or a proficiency level of Novice High on the ACTFL Guidelines; or
 - LING:3001: Introduction to Linguistics (or comparable course) with grade of "B" or higher.

Application Components. In addition to this application form, submit:

- A one-page essay explaining why you wish to teach ESL.
- Transcript(s) of all college-level courses.

Applications are reviewed twice yearly following the application deadlines of March 1 and October 1.
